Composting Etiquette Continued



These are pictures of items that I pulled out of the two compost bins closest to the shed.

These items do not decompose and should be placed in the trash receptacles in the front or rear of the garden. <u>As a reminder</u> <u>again</u>, do not throw these items into the compost bins:

plastic or plastic-coated products bioplastics or treated wood meat, bones or dairy products cooked foods (salt is harmful to worms) grass clippings or weeds anything treated with chemicals, etc. plastic vegetable pots and tags diseased tomato, zucchini, or squash plants gift wrapping ribbon or socks

<u>Water</u>
