Garden Waste & Weeds Continued

Diseased plants and/or weeds should be removed from the garden. Large plants, like zucchini and summer squash, should be cut up into small pieces before they are placed into the compost bins to help them decompose in a timely manner. There are garden bags for everyone's use in the shed. The City has been removing them if they are placed next to the trash barrel behind the garden next to the bench.
