As a Reminder

The Medford Garden Commission and Riverbend Community Garden (RCG) limit Medford residents to one garden plot citywide. RCG vets new member applicants with the Medford Garden Commission, and we share our yearly roster with them, to ensure that there are no duplicate memberships. RCG members who maintain more than one community plot citywide shall forfeit their garden fee and membership.

What's New for 2024

Workdays:

As previously mentioned, rainy weekends during the 2023 garden season are the main reason why 33 percent of garden members did not honor their commitment to workdays. This year, to reduce this percentage, we will:

- only cancel or reschedule workdays if thunderstorms are forecasted.
- If thunderstorms are only scheduled for Saturday, the workday will be held on Sunday Morning from 7/8 – 10/11AM.
- If thunderstorms are scheduled for Monday, the workday will be held on Wednesday.
- Garden members and their spouse or partner will be able to work on the same workday but are limited to 1.5 hours per person per workday.
- No one will receive workday credit for work performed outside of scheduled workdays, unless specifically authorized by the Steering Committee.
- No one will receive workday credit for lending a hand to gardeners who need assistance with their plots, outside of scheduled workdays.
